

breed. He grew up in pharaoh's palace, surrounded by ostentatious wealth from the world's superpower of the time. He had the best education, the finest garments and everything at his beck and call. Strangely, in spite of his privileged upbringing, he still could empathize with the lowly and downtrodden. This attribute would lead to his self exile after killing an Egyptian in an attempt to break up a fight. Moses would live the next forty years in the backwoods looking after sheep, a far cry from pharaoh's ritzy palace. Moses had experientially lived through two worlds at the opposite spectrum of each other. Moses was a man that walked so closely with God that he spoke face to face with the Almighty. In the above scripture, Moses is in the sunset of what has been an exceptionally storied life and he is laying emphasis on crucial aspects of the law. One of his key takeaways from his walk with God is that He is faithful even to a thousand generations. In biblical language, a day is like a thousand years and a thousand years is like a day.

But, beloved, do not forget this one thing, that with the Lord one day is as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day.

2 Peter 3: 8 NKJV

A thousand years is a full day in God. With God there is no darkness. His light overcomes any darkness. A full day with the Lord is one where the manifestation of His nature is made manifest. arrived in Sydney in the 1st of January 2014. I drove 12 hours from Brisbane to Sydney with my then 3-year-old daughter. I was determined to start afresh after life hadn't gone the way I hoped it would go.

I remember stopping to stretch on the highway somewhere close to Taree. I read a sign that said Sydney 300 km's. At that moment in time I remember thinking to myself that I was crazy and wanted to turn around. However, I had driven so far turning around now wasn't an option. My daughter and I got back into the car and continued with our journey where we only knew my great aunt and her daughter (my aunt). Just after 12 midnight we arrived where we would be staying. I didn't have a job but I was determined to make it. I shared a house with 2 other people. Over the next 6 weeks I applied for jobs and didn't get a response until one day a lady I had emailed before I left Queensland got back to me and asked me if I had arrived in Sydney. She told me that she had some work for me. That was great news. I started working but it was very slow. I only worked 15 hours a fortnight. I wasn't familiar with Sydney so I would get lost a lot and my phone at the time didn't have a good navigation app. I got lost close to home one day but whilst I was lost I saw an aged care centre. After 3 days I walked into that aged care centre and I asked for an application form. I was told that they weren't hiring at that moment in time but I was still given the application form. A few days later I returned my application form with my resume attached. I didn't hear anything from them for 3 weeks! They eventually called and I was asked to come in for an interview.

My interview started with a tour around the facility and then we went back to the managers office. I had no experience working as a nurse. I had graduated 6 months prior and hadn't been able to find a job as an EN in Brisbane. The manager told me that she was going to give me chance and hired me. I left there feeling as though I was on cloud nine. 2 weeks later I started working. I remember every morning I would listen to 'Never would have made it by Marvin Sapp' and I would feel encouraged. Working as a nurse meant I had to do morning and afternoon shifts. Mornings were easy because I took my daughter to childcare slightly earlier than the other kids and picked her up afterwards. Afternoons meant I had to ask someone to watch her between 6 and 10pm. In this case it was the manager from the childcare centre. When I went to look for a place for Faith I had a chat with the lady and I told her I didn't have much support with looking after Faith as both my aunts lived further away from me. The manager said that if I needed help with Faith she would do that for me as she was also a single Mum and she knew how difficult it would be. We agreed on a fair rate that I would pay her each week for the extra care. As time went by I started meeting people and making friends. Some of these friends became my family and would later on help me with looking after my daughter.

When Faith started school I was able to find a babysitter who would pick her up from school 2 days a week and stay with her until I had finished work at 2130 meaning I would only get home at 2200. One day my Dad called me and asked me what my plans were for the future. I'm not sure how I responded but I probably just said work for the next couple of years. He suggested

that I do a Master of Business Administration. Studving wasn't something that I wanted to do at that moment in time but I figured I would just apply to make him happy. I thought that since I hadn't been to University in 8 years, I probably wouldn't be accepted then I would just tell my Dad I wasn't accepted and that would be the end of it. I submitted my application and they asked for my transcripts including those from TAFE. I had to make calls to my previous Uni and TAFE to ask my transcripts as I had misplaced the other ones. They said it would take at least a week for the transcripts to arrive which was fine. After 2 weeks, I received another letter in the mail from the University telling me that I had been accepted into the MBA program. How was this even possible? I hadn't even sent my transcripts. There was no backing down now-I had to do my MBA. The program ran for 2 years full time or 4 years part time. I opted to do it part-time as I was working and looking after my daughter on my own. I began my program in April 2016. I had my classes in Parramatta once a week from 6-10pm. My friends, their parents and my aunties (older women who I had developed relationships with) looked after my daughter during this period in time. During Power Conference 2017, I received a prophecy from Mayor Moore. He spoke to me privately as he prayed for me and he told me that I shouldn't worry about school and that I would finish on time. At that moment in time I was doubting whether I actually had the ability to complete the course. Over the years I had to remind myself of this prophecy because there were days that I wanted to give up.

In September 2017, I got employed by NSW Health. This meant that doing night shift

was now compulsory. My work roster was always scheduled in such a way that I would have class and work on the same night. Those days were hectic as I would pick Faith up from school, get her ready for the night, have dinner, pack a bag, drop her off and make my way to uni. I would leave class earlier so I could get ready for work. I was received a lot of support during that time which I'm forever grateful for. I felt guilty that I was working at various hours of the day and missing out my child's development so I started looking for a new job and in March 2018 I started working a 9-5 job which meant I was able to take my daughter to school in the morning and pick her up afterwards. I was also able to do homework with her and spend more time

I continued with my studies and in my final year things became more challenging. I had to do a business project over 6 months which meant instead of taking one unit at a time I did 2 units a semester. My friends would look after Faith twice a week whilst I was at uni. In July 2019 my grandfather suddenly died. It was a week before I was scheduled to travel to Zimbabwe to do some research for my business project and as part of my friend's bridal party. I was devastated. I wanted to be there with my family especially my mother but I was unable to change my flight. I flew home the next week. I had 2 assignments due soon which I thought I would be able to do once I got home but I was in for a surprise. There was no electricity during the day and it would come back on at night when most people are sleeping. There was also a fuel shortage so using the generator all day wasn't an option. I also had to spend time with my family who were grieving and had

part of GPM and I too can be a champion. I completed my studies in December 2019 and was due to graduate in April

2020. Unfortunately, COVID-19 postponed graduation. I received my certificate at the beginning of May. All of this wouldn't have been possible without God who gave me strength (Philippians 4 vs 13) and hope when I wanted to give up, my parents who have always supported me throughout my life, Papa and Mama who have taught me so much about God and have opened my eyes to how prayer can change your life, my Sydney family, friends and aunties who looked after Faith so that I could work and study. I am also grateful to my friends in Brisbane and Adelaide who encouraged me to keep going on days that I wanted to give up. Thank you all so much. To God be the

champions so I had to also tell myself that I'm

bridesmaid duties to fulfill. I was only home for 2 weeks and it flew by quickly. I asked for an extension for both my assignments from my lecturers so I was allowed to submit my assignments a week after I got back to Sydney. When I came back I started to grieve again on my own. I was very close to my grandfather and the thought of not being able to see him again really hurt but I had to be strong and get myself together so that I could complete my program. My mother and father also continued to encourage me with prayers and cheering me on. My Dad would always say how he is looking forward to graduation so we can celebrate 'OUR' MBA together. He calls it his MBA because he planted the seed My mother would always quote bible verses such as Philippians 4 vs 6. I know that Papa and Mama prayed for me and during meetings Papa would remind me that with God all things are possible (Matthew 19: 24). GPM is raising





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THROUGH THE EYES OFGOD: Homage to a Kingdom Chapion

have shared that my mother once brought an astrologer to our house to read our palms and tell us our future. Examining my hands, the soothsayer confidently pronounced that I would not travel far or much in my life. "That's what the lines on your hand tell me. There is no future for you abroad."

I was deeply disappointed to hear this, but oh, how mistaken he was! After 45 years of spanning the globe and speaking in countless countries, I am persuaded that God alone, the Grand Weaver, knows our future and knits our lives. He has brought lasting change not only in my own life but in my family as well. Sometimes this has happened seemingly instantaneously; hearing Jesus's words in John 14:19, "Because I live, you also will live," literally brought me from the brink of death in a hospital room to new life. Other times, such as in the remarkable conversion of my father years later, many seeds were planted prior, but the change was no less profound.

I recall, too, that I was never much of a reader growing up, preferring to watch movies or discuss issues with people. I very rarely picked up a book out of interest. But then one evening in my late teens, and a few months since coming to Christ on a bed of

suicide, I walked out the back door of our house and saw something lying on top of the garbage heap in the alley. As I looked closer, I saw it was a book with no cover—an old, tattered copy of a volume I realized my dad must have thrown out.

Curious, I picked it up and read the title page: The Epistle to the Romans: A Commentary by a man named W. H. Griffith Thomas. I had no idea who this author was, but my hunger was so fierce that I immediately opened it and began to read. Over the next few days, I devoured that book—of all things, a Bible commentary! It became a treasure, and I still have the tattered copy of that commentary in my possession.

Just like that, I was plunged into a world I'd never known—the world of reading. One of the first volumes I was presented with was The Cross and the Switchblade, an amazing story of the conversion of Nicky Cruz the gang leader and of the work God was doing in the lives of such young people through the ministry of David Wilkerson. I loved the book so much that I began seeking out biographies. I lapped up the stories of William Booth, founder of the Salvation Army; David Brainerd, the missionary to American Indians; and, most intriguing of all to me, C. T. Studd,

the English cricketer who gave up everything to become a missionary. Studd had been the captain of Cambridge's cricket team, had turned down an opportunity to play for his country, and even refused his family inheritance—all to help take the gospel into China and India.

As I read about these inspiring lives, the old adage became true for me: "Fire begets fire." The standards these Christians set by their examples raised the bar for me. Though I later learned, as I grew in my faith, that these saintly lives weren't as perfect as their biographers made them out to be, the basic truths were undoubtedly in place, and their examples stoked my consciousness as to what the Christian life could be.

For the first time, I felt my mind being stretched—and I loved it. I realized that thinking could be fun, and with that simple realization I was sent headlong into the lifelong discipline of reading.

I also cannot say enough about the significance of the role that Youth for Christ (YFC) played in those early days of my conversion. On the day that I tried to take my life, it was these friends who prayed for me. A man named Fred David—sent, I would discover only recently, by YFC Asia director John Teibe, another gift from God—brought a Bible to my hospital room (and, by proxy, the words that breathed eternal life into my broken body). Both before and after my suicide attempt, they showed me that I meant something and that God loved me as an individual. It was my relationships at YFC that gave me hope of coming back to a caring group. And it was they who, as time passed, gave me opportunities for leadership.

So there it all was, the unlikely strands that came together, weaving the small patch of fabric that was my conversion: a soft-spoken man who drew me to the message of truth, a group waiting to share the love of Christ with me in my time of greatest need, a Bible brought to my mother for me, and a passage of Scripture that sprouted in the moisture of God's sovereign grace. It all came together for me in the hospital room, but Youth for Christ is where those seeds were sown. I had now found a new home in my faith—and I could say I was finally home.

Along with everyone else, I wondered how such a turnaround could have taken place, and so swiftly. The key was that now I looked at life through a window of meaning. And that was the one thing I had been desperately longing for: meaning. Now everything in my life was packed with it: my studies had meaning, my family had meaning, my friendships had meaning, my sports had meaning.

All the things I had thought were the causes of my despair—my

failing studies, my senseless wandering, my hopelessness—had actually been the results of my despair. The Austrian concentration camp survivor Viktor Frankl wrote, "Without meaning, nothing else matters. With meaning, everything else falls into place." If you can't see the why, you cannot live for the what. And as soon as I was able to answer the "why," even my failures began to make sense.

The rapid changes taking place in me daily were beyond my power to describe. Yet, from everything I had learned in my life with Christ, I knew that He had not just changed what I did but what I wanted to do. One day, I had been a creature of despair, irresponsibility, and failure. Then I became a creature of hope, diligent and accomplished in the things to which I set my hand. To me, the reversal was staggering. Nobody fully understood the dramatic transformation on the inside. This was the work of God.

It was also a huge paradigm shift for me to suddenly see life—my own and others'—through the eyes of God. For years, I had looked at life the way a kid might work through a puzzling, new toy, taking it apart but not knowing how to put it back together again. He wonders, "What makes this thing tick?" So he takes a screwdriver and tries to unpack it, but with each piece he removes, it makes less sense.

Only Jesus could legitimately explain the multifarious strands of human personality locked within me. He could explain my emotional life, my actions, and my reactions. He could explain why I longed for human touch, and why it was actually the touch of soul that I was ultimately after. Without Christ, I still would have the gnawing undercurrent that had run through everything in my life and that had led me to the tragic choice that very nearly brought me to an end.

Jesus wasn't just the best option to me; He was the only option. He provided the skin of reason to the flesh and bones of reality. His answers to life's questions were both unique and true. No one else answered the deepest questions of the soul the way He did. And because Christianity was true, it was emotionally experienced. There was no greater example of this than my own life.

The story of my early days was that only God's grace could have brought about this new life for me. This was a new DNA, a new birth. There simply was no other explanation. The songwriter George Wade Robinson said it well:

Heav'n above is softer blue, Earth around is sweeter green! Something lives in every hue Christless eyes have never seen; Birds with gladder songs o'erflow, Flow'rs with deeper beauties shine, Since I know, as now I know, I am His, and He is mine.
