#### THE LAW

ong before modern nations of the earth were formed, God entered a covenant with the children of Israel through their father Abraham. He gave them a set of laws through Moses and they lived under a theocracy where He, God, was both their King and God (Exodus 20:1-17). Although present day nations do not have God as their king, they have laws which regulate the activities of the society, just like God gave to His own people as their king. This shows that the law is the most critical aspect of any society if that society must work well.

### WHAT IS THE LAW?


The law, according to the Merriam Webster dictionary is defined as the system of rules which a particular country or community recognizes as regulating the actions of its members and which it may enforce by the imposition of punishment for disobedience. The law is based on the nature and the structure of the society created by a social contract.

A social contract, according to the freedom dictionary, is an agreement among the members of a society on the one hand, waiving some of their rights or freedom to cooperate



for protection and other social benefits by a government on the other hand . For example, when a group of people in a defined social and territorial landmark gives up some of their individual freedom for state protection.

# SUPREMACY OF The law

aws are mostly based on the traditions, customs, and expectations of the people. The first set of laws in the organisation of a society is called the constitution. Any other law, thereafter, is invalid to the extent of its contradiction to the constitution. Once a law is passed it becomes supreme and binding on all the parties involved. Thomas Fuller said hundreds of years ago, 'Be ye never so high, the law is above you'. Though debatable in some societies it was true then and it is still true today, everyone is under the law in a modern society.

The laws are made to guide and regulate how we live in a society. The laws of God to his people were also made to the same end and purpose. The laws that were given to Moses by God for His people have two major parts. One part has to do with the regulation of the relationship between people and God. The second part has to do with the regulation of the relationship between people in the society. For the law to regulate how we live and relate with God and other people, it must touch every aspect of life. Therefore, per the orderly regulation of all human activities the law then is the ultimate.

supremacy of the law does not operate on its own. It means every person must be subject to the laws concerning every relationship and activity both with others and with God. For there to be order in the society there must be that obedience to the laws of the society. However, there is a challenge.

### THE PARADOX OF THE LAW

It was Lord Denning who said that "God should forbid that a lawyer should know all the laws." (Minow, M. 1990). It is impossible for anybody for that matter to know all the laws in the society, so it is impossible to obey all the laws that exist because the laws that are not known cannot be obeyed. In modern criminal law, ignorance of the law is not an excuse, and under the laws of God, once you break one law you have broken all the laws.


This means that the society cannot be in a perfect order because it is the obedience to the laws of the society that enforces order in the society.

When the laws are not known then they are difficult to obey, and when the laws are not obeyed then perfect order cannot be in place.

The challenge is that many believe that the laws are made to be broken. There is a principle of law that says that the laws are made for man and not man for the laws ". So, there is this confusion and frustration and indeed a paradox with the law that though supreme but not inviolable.

From the experience of Paul, the apostle, and indeed the general observation, it is a matter of fact that laws are always broken no matter how much you try. It is natural to do the very opposite of the law except for the fear of punishment. Under the modern criminal law, an accused is innocent until the accused is proven guilty by a competent court even if in fact, the crime was committed by the person. But before God who always sees and knows all things, we become helpless because he uses even our hearts to judge us. In the light of this frustration of the power that the law gives to disobedience, Paul cried out in the book of Romans chapter 7:24, "oh what a wretched man that I am..."

There must be a missing link somewhere because God is not the author of confusion. God would not give us laws to enforce disobedience and disorder. He certainly gave us laws to regulate our living in an orderly society. However, the general experience of people is to the contrary most of the time. Is it because we do not obey the law or is it because we do not know all the laws or is it because the law empowers us to disobey rather than obey? What is wrong, and why this paradox.

esus said he did not come to abort the laws but to fulfill them (Matthew 5:17). To me it is one of His most profound statements throughout His earthly ministry. And yes, He fulfilled the law because he was the first entity in flesh to have kept all the laws FOR GOD without fail in every aspect of it. He was tried many times in many ways, but no wrong was found in him (Luke 23:4, 1 Peter 2:22).


Matthew 22:37-40, a pharisees asked Jesus; Master, which is the greatest of all the laws? And Jesus answered him and said "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind' - this is the great and foremost commandment, and there is a second like it, 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself'. There is no other commandment greater than these. The whole Law and Prophets hang on these two commands." This is also recorded in Mark 12:28-34.

In His answer to the Pharisees who asked the question, Jesus Christ mentioned the law, and the prophets. The law and the prophet as stated by Jesus Christ has to do with the totality of all the word of God as recorded in the Old Testament, which was mainly the laws, the prophecies, and God's dealings with His people.

It is rather curious that the answer was not refuted by the then lord of the law who asked Jesus. Because in this answer lies the missing link, the power for the fulfillment of the law. The whole of the laws and the prophets are operated by love. Jesus Christ said the whole Law and Prophets hang on these two commands:

This means that love is what holds the laws together or rather love sustains the laws. In other words, love is the operative tool for the fulfilment of the laws. Laws, whether they be laws of God or laws of man can fulfill its purpose only if love is in the equation. This means that love is supreme to laws.







### CONCLUSION

In our walk with God and with our fellow humans the greatest virtue that sums up all other virtues is love. Love for God means God is primary in all our considerations and then love for others. For God anything done out of love is null and void. Even if you keep all the laws to the later without love it is nothing. This was expressly stated by Jesus in the book of Matthew 12:10 - 13 where Jesus was asked whether it was lawful to heal on the sabbath days. And after giving an analogy he said unto them, "Wherefore it is lawful to do well on the sabbath days". To better understand this, the traditional interpretation of the law is that it is unlawful to do anything on a sabbath. But Jesus said it's lawful to do well on a sabbath. Well in this case means acts of kindness, compassion springing from the expression of love. So here Jesus again is validating the supremacy of love over laws.

In his letter to the believers in Corinth, Paul expounded on this principle of the supremacy of love when he wrote, "Though I speak with the tongues of men and of angels, and have no love, I am become as sounding brass, or a tinkling cymbal. And though I have the gift of prophecy, and understand all mysteries, and all knowledge; and though I have all faith, so that I could remove mountains, and have not love, I am nothing. And though I bestow all my goods to feed the poor, and though I give my body to be burned, and have not love, it profited me nothing" (1 Corinthians 13:1 – 3). Whatever is done without love according to Paul the apostle, is null and void and amounts to a waste of time even if it is in obedience to the laws.

Love is the missing link in the fulfilment of the laws. The purpose of the laws is order in both the vertical and the horizontal relationship. This is impossible without love. Conclusively, whatever you do, do it out of love first for God and for humans, for above this there is no law (1 Corinthians 16:14, Galatian 5:23). Indeed, love is supreme to the law because as Paul would put it, the greatest of all that abides is love (1 Corinthian 13: 13).

y name is Tecla Mururi and I'm a registered nurse by profession. I've been a registered nurse for the past 30 years and I have been in business since 2011. In 2016, we launched into the home care industry and have been doing this for the past five years now.

There's a little bit of history to how we got into business, and this dates back to 2002. When I first migrated to Australia in August of that year, I came alone and had left my beautiful family back home in Zimbabwe. My plan was to get my family to Sydney by Christmas of that year. This meant I had to work extra hours for this goal to be achieved. I joined a little nursing agency that would send me to do some work in the affluent parts of Sydney and I remember the first day I set foot into a particular aged care facility. It was very huge, and I had learnt that some of the creme de la creme of Australia who were retiring and doing their last leg of life went into care. I found this disheartening, not because the elderly were being ill-treated, but it was just a culture shock for me. I had grown up in a place where this model of care for the elder did not exist, and instead they would always be with family and/or have someone looking after them in their own homes.

The idea of an aged care approach was not how I had anticipated we would say thank you or appreciate our elderly. However, in saying that, I acknowledged that things were different in Australia. So I did what I knew to do and made sure that I gave my all to caring in that role – giving what I knew best - the compassion, the love and the care. I did struggle with this, but I kept on doing what I believed in, which is to look after our elderly, all the while praying and just talking to God about that situation. I would always ask God, 'Is this all?' Is this how we can say thank you to our elderly who have gone before us? One day, I heard very clearly in my heart that there is middle ground and for a while this kept on playing out to me – 'there is a middle ground'. It was from this that the idea of a business occurred, and this drove me to where I am now, operating our business called 'Right At Home' which is part of the Aged Care industry.

We had a property that we sold some years ago at a record price. Really, the Lord came through and when I say this, I don't say it lightly. This all came as a result of taking the journey with faith and walking the walk with the set man, Prophet Richard Amoaye. There is no step that we took without him or speaking with him. We saw the hand of God in establishing this business and our first office in Padstow.

Along the way we have faced challenges with staffing and getting contracts among many other challenges. Just getting to grow the business took longer and as with new business, cash flow was an issue. Sometimes you do work and, you know, the invoices are not paid on time, but in all this we've never looked back. In the midst of the Corona virus while some businesses were folding up and scaling down, left right and centre, for us it was the opposite. We saw the hand of God manifest and we have continued to see exponential growth in every aspect of the business. Our second office was birthed and opened in Kogarah. We had the blessing and pleasure of this office being commissioned by the set man of the house, Prophet Richard. We are forever grateful to God for using him in our lives.

### THE GREATEST LOVE GIFT

'and behind the second veil, the part of the tabernacle which is called the Holiest of All' and in Hebrews 9:7 where it states, 'but into the second part the high priest went alone once a year, not without blood, which he offered for himself and for the people's sins committed in ignorance'.

### **HEBREWS 9: 3**

Love is the greatest gift of all. We know this because it is recorded in 1 Corinthians 13. The extent to which love can be expressed might be a little difficult to comprehend. This includes the love that surpasses all human understanding.

We are fortunate to be the recipients of the greatest love gift of all times. God in His infinite mercies loves us so much that He was willing to give up His only son for you and me. For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son...(John 3:16).I don't know how many parents would willingly give up their only child for the benefit of mankind. If there are such parents today, I guess their existence would only be confined to figments of someone's imagination.

Why was it necessary for this gift to be given? Let's go back to the beginning from where it all started. From the moment man gulped the first piece of that forbidden fruit in disobedience, iniquity gained entrance into the world. This created a great divide between us and God. And sadly, everyone who came afterwards also had a fair share of that iniquity. Therefore, just as through one man sin entered the world, and death through sin, and thus death spread to all men, because all sinned (Romans 5:12).

For a while it seemed that the blood of bulls and calves were sufficient to atone for sins as there is no remission without the shedding of blood. This is resonated in Hebrews 9:22, according to the law almost all things are purified with blood, and without shedding of blood there is no remission. But this was only a temporary measure. The whole process needed to be repeated, almost resembling an exercise in futility. Numerous episodes of this are contained in the Old Testament. Only the High priest at the time had access to the Holy of Holies. We are told of this in Hebrews 9:3 where it reads, 'and behind the second veil, the part of the tabernacle which is called the Holiest of All' and in Hebrews 9:7 where it states, 'but into the second part the high priest went alone once a year, not without blood, which he offered for himself and for the people's sins committed in ignorance'.

So, whatever discussion you wanted to have in that place could only be conducted through the High priest. If you missed the event in one year, you would have no other option than to wait for the following year. Meanwhile, God's perfect plan was in the offing. It was only a function of time before the son of God would manifest. God gave Jesus up as a replacement sacrifice for all the bulls and calves. Christ came as High Priest of the good things to come, with the greater and more perfect tabernacle not made with hands, that is, not of this creation. Not with the blood of goats and calves, but with His own blood He entered the Most Holy Place once for all, having obtained eternal redemption (Hebrews 9:11-12).

The death on the cross is actually the perfected sacrifice that takes away the sins of the world. Because of this, we no longer have to offer animal sacrifices as atonement for sin. What are the benefits of this wonderful love package? A bridge has been constructed over that great divide. We have been invited to approach the throne of grace with confidence. Our adoption as sons of God has already been finalized, so get ready, we have been made joint heirs with Christ. Most of all, we have a promise of everlasting life as our names are registered in the Book of Life.

Now, just before you get too excited and miss the basics, there is a condition to enjoying all that has been listed above. Imagine that a friend of yours sends you a surprise gift. The postman arrives at your door with the parcel and you excitedly answer the door. Is there a way to access the content of the parcel without receiving it first from the postman? I guess your answer is no. It is the same with this gift from God. You need to first receive the gift before you access the content. And how can you receive this gift? I will like to draw your attention to John 3:16 where it says, 'For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten son, that whosoever believes in him shall not perish but have everlasting life', and John 1:12, 'to as many as believe in him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe in his name'. So there, the gift is the Lord Jesus Christ. If you receive (believe in) this gift, you will have everlasting life (registration in the Book of Life). And you will become a son of God, which means your adoption will be finalized, making you a joint heir with Christ.


Oh, and the good news is that the greatest love gift of all times is still available. If you would like to receive this gift right now, you can pray this simple prayer:

## OF FEASTS, FESTIVITIES, AND THE LOVE OF BREAD!

*"Then Jesus declared, I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty".* 

**JOHN 6: 35** 

The Christmas season is upon us and what's a festive season without some reasonable thoughts about feasting? I must confess, having spent what feels like a lifetime in lockdown for part of this year there is a greater part of me that is 'cautiously excited' about feasting. There are some Covid calories that still need to be dealt with. However, carbs remain on the menu, and one cannot talk about carbs without thinking about bread, cakes and the likes (please don't judge!).

Speaking of bread, if you missed out on some of the Afternoon Infusion sessions with Prophet Richard Amoaye over the month of November, I'd highly recommend you find your way to the 'Richard Amoaye Ministries' Facebook page to catch up with the "Customs of Jesus" series. As part of this, Prophet Richard spent some time on a thought-provoking piece about the 'Breaking of Bread' which I'd like to share about.

At the start of the reflection, it was established that breaking bread remains relevant to the modern-day believer's walk with Christ. The focus was on how Jesus was confronted by the Pharisees regarding some of His practices and those of His disciples. Specifically, the Pharisees were troubled by the fact that Jesus ate with sinners and that His disciples did not fast like the disciples of John the Baptist.

Drawing on the scripture, Prophet Richard shared some intriguing mysteries about the identities of Christ. He indicated that Jesus was conceived in Nazareth, but he was born in Bethlehem which means 'house of bread'. Not only that, in John 6 verse 35 it says "Then Jesus declared, I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty". Thus, the bread of life was born in the house of bread!

An even more intriguing point raised in the reflection was that of the many things Jesus could have asked us to do before ascending into heaven, He chose to place emphasis on us breaking bread together (1 Corinthians 17-33). When you then closely observe the life of Jesus, you realise that what He asked us to do was a practice He had maintained throughout His ministry. He never missed an opportunity to break bread and never turned down an offer to eat with the sinners.

Prophet Richard stated that when Jesus ate with the tax collectors and people who were considered sinners, unclean or outside the covenant, He saw the breaking of bread as an opportunity to not just eat but share with them a spiritual kind of food too! It had a lot more to do with holistic food and feeding and sharing Himself as the bread that came from heaven. For Jesus, eating with sinners was an extension of His ministry.

While mathematics is not one of my favourite subjects, I do quite like some 'biblical mathematics'. So when there was mention of a spiritual kind of food, I could not help but wonder what this meant. Some moments after the Afternoon Infusion, I was drawn to the book of 1 John. In chapter 4 verse 8 we learn that God is love. We also know for a fact that what is true of God is also true of Jesus, who is part of the Trinity. So it stands to reason that Jesus is love. Therefore, the bread of life aka Jesus = love. It was then that a lot more made sense. I realised that when we speak of breaking bread it is about sharing the bread of life and in sharing the bread of life we are sharing love! Not just love as we understand it but the true and authentic love that is Christ!

What Jesus modelled was that It is ok to receive invitations from those who do not know Christ. Being a Christian is not an excuse to not engage with people. It is quite the opposite and the mere fact that we keep company with unbelievers doesn't mean they are automatically our bosom buddies, neither does it defile us. What should matter is the intent with which we accept invitations and how we then conduct ourselves when in their presence.

Of course, we do still need to exercise a level of diligence and wisdom when accepting invitations, and we should always be in tune with our spirit to understand how we 'read the room'. However, when conversation arises at the table, opportunities are being created for us to speak and share about Christ and the goodness of God! Mind-blowing, isn't it? So, my two key takeaways about the breaking of bread were these:

- 1. You need the bread of life (Jesus). You cannot do life without Jesus and when you think about your growth and nourishment, you should focus on physical and spiritual nourishment. Food for the body and food for the soul and spirit!
- 2. You should share the bread of life (Jesus). What and who we receive at salvation is for the sharing as is the nourishment we gain from being in relationship with Christ. Having received Jesus, it is also your duty to share the good news and share about Him with your loved ones and strangers alike! In essence the bread of life is not just for our nourishment but for the nourishment of others.

As I mentioned at the start, a thought-provoking approach to the idea of food and sharing meals! In wrapping up I'd like to encourage you to take some time to reflect on this, especially with the season that is upon us. Think about what you will eat, when you will eat and most importantly why it is you will eat.

So, dear reader, go forth, bring out the fine china and make good use of those culinary skills! If this is not your department, fear not, there's always need for cleaners and dessert bringers. Considering the reason for the Christmas season upon us, see the opportunity to break bread as one for the taking!










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### RAM Programmes
